Catholic schools have existed in Colorado since 1864 when the Sisters of Loretto founded the first Catholic school at the invitation of Bishop Joseph P. Machbeuf. One of the oldest Archdiocesan Catholic schools in Denver is Annunciation Catholic School in Denver. Annunciation opened in September of 1889 and is still serving families with students in grades Kindergarten – 8th grade.
