Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Denver exist to cultivate in students and the whole school community a love for Jesus Christ, fidelity to his Church, and **commitment to the dignity of the human person**. Curriculum objectives that focus on the sanctity of all human life are incorporated into various subject areas so this aspect of the faith is address frequently throughout the school year. During the month of October, special emphasis is placed on respect life activities including:

- Pray the rosary once a week
- Announce special prayers and intentions over school-wide PA system
- Address various social issues surrounding right-to-life issues throughout the curriculum in one-on-one and small group formats
- Participate in poster contest – “Respect for babies, born and unborn”
- Participate in essay contest – “Controversy of Embryonic Stem Cell Research”

Winning essays and posters at the school’s local level are submitted to the Respect Life Office for consideration in their archdiocesan-wide contests.
